


# SHAKE UP THE ESTABLISHMENT ANNUAL REPORT 2023

### LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Shake Up The Establishment (SUTE) is a national youth-led registered not-for-profit organization (#1190975-4) that focuses on promoting climate justice within the geographical confines of what is currently "Canada". We use known as an intersectional approach to promote nonpolitical advocacy, partisan craft accessible evidence-informed educational resources to improve climate and environmental literacv and work to collaborate directly with underserved and structurally vulnerable communities to address injustices. Although we are a national organization with team members from across what is currently Canada, our founders dreamt up, organized and registered this organization upon Treaty 3 lands, belonging to the Erie, Neutral, Huron-Wendat. Haudenosaunee and Mississaugas Peoples. We acknowledge that our actions as an organization and the work that we put out have an impact on these lands and upon all that call it home. We are humbled to be able to follow the lead of Indigenous-led efforts towards the protection and stewardship of this environment since time immemorial across these lands we currently call 'Canada.' We honour the contributions of Indigenous, Black and other racialized peoples within the climate justice space and recognize their resiliency in the face of systemic oppression imposed by the settler colonial state. We aim to incorporate joy, rest and dreaming of futures throughout our work, particularly for racialized and/or Indigenous Peoples, women and genderdiverse peoples, low-income, neurodiverse, and (dis)abled youth, to help craft a more sustainable movement. We want to make space for people to reflect on their relationship to lands they live, work and thrive upon, and encourage all to show up responsibly and in solidarity with Indigenous communities to care for and nourish each other and these lands accordingly.

We actively employ anti-oppressive practices, safe space policies and accountability procedures and value them above all deliverables and work. We continue to learn about historical and present injustices to ensure we promote the use of a trauma-informed, equitycentred approach in our work through our anti-colonial educational storytelling platform, Righting History, and Righting History's Active Learning Club initiative, which is mandatory for all members at SUTE to participate in.

SUTE views the work that we do as a form of distributive justice and radical change making. We prioritize our member's priorities first, with 'no questions asked' time off, codesigned contracts, and ethical wages for paid opportunities. We continue to adapt and optimize our contractual agreement process and invest in enriching our space to continue to support diversity, inclusion, equity, and justice to create space for youth activists in this movement.

#### Self-reported data from SUTE members

- 93% of members self -identify as women or gender-diverse
- 75% leadership positions are occupied by individuals who self-identify as women
- 50% members of our Board of Directors self-identify as racialized women
- 39% of members self-identify as neurodiverse


#### **Our Approach**

SUTE is an organization that focuses on climate justice through awareness campaigns, educational resource creation, and collaborations directly with communities working to address injustices, improve climate literacy, and most importantly, support political action. As always, we remain non-partisan, scientifically informed, and youth-led.

To quote the UN, "the impacts of climate change will not be borne equally or fairly, between rich and poor, women and men, and older and younger generations". Consequently, there has been a shift in the climate change discourse from recycling and economic imperatives to human rights and political accountability. Essentially, climate justice is a human-centred approach, informed by science, which works to protect the rights of "the most vulnerable people and share the burdens and benefits of climate change and its impacts equitably and fairly" (Mary Robinson Foundation, 2020).

Creating sustainable solutions and policies to combat climate change has been the greatest challenge facing our generation. Working together with youth across Canada, SUTE takes an intersectional approach to address climate justice and intertwined systemic issues that lead to inequitable health and life experiences.

### **OUR GOALS:**



To demand a climate action plan from political leaders that will reduce emissions and waste production, promote renewable energy and conservation, and support structurally vulnerable, historically underrepresented and minoritized, and underserved communities above all else.

To hold the Canadian government accountable for their promises made towards human health and wellbeing, inclusive environmental protection, climate action, and the environmental determinants of health.

To educate and increase the public's understanding of climate justice-related topics by contributing to research in this field, and by disseminating information on these topics through educational resources, awareness campaigns.

To foster meaningful relationships and partnerships with key community stakeholders & ally organizations, expand and build on existing initiatives, and amplify underrepresented voices and stories.



### THIS YEAR AT SUTE



Righting History is a collaborative anti-colonial history and storytelling-focused climate justice education platform. It was created by Shake Up The Establishment in 2022 to fill the gaps of unwritten and incorrect historical takes that have been dominated by white-supremacist settler colonial narratives. We believe that this plays a large role in shaping the necessary context for the progress of our movements and achieving social and climate justice. Over the past year, this initiative created 3 paid leadership positions for youth, 2/3 identifying as BIPOC women. With the support of Foundation for Environmental Stewardship and Canada Summer Jobs, we prioritized equitable wages at \$22.25 per hour.

Righting History also houses our Active Learning Club resources that are mandatory for SUTE members and made publicly available to promote learning about historic and current systems of oppression.

## THIS YEAR AT SUTE

Practicing Rest, Recovery, Resistance: An Interactive Dreaming Journal

We published our first book! Written by our team of experienced, intersectional, youth climate justice organizers, this interactive journal enlists readers to explore and play with SUTE's Rest, Recovery and Resistance (3RS) framework (a spin on sustainability's well-known slogan "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle"). The new 3RS focuses on investing in the change-makers themselves, particularly equity-deserving youth for climate justice, to ensure the long-term sustainability of the environmental movement amidst cooccurring crises and capitalism. This book (or rather, a love letter from SUTE to the wider community) is a must-have for climate activists, community organizers and engaged citizens alike.

Featuring 244 hand-illustrated pages, 40+ thoughtful activities, dreamy creative pieces, and interactive evidence-informed readings with QR codes linked to critical resources, this journal functions as an organizer's manual that guides readers on how to incorporate intersectionality, systems-thinking, & decolonial practices within their climate solutions work.

With the support of our funders, this initiative created **7 paid positions** for youth in what is currently Canada, with over half identifying as BIPOC.



### THIS YEAR AT SUTE

#### Shake Up Your Community

Shake Up Your Community (SUYC) provides volunteer and paid opportunities to young organizers from various regions across what is currently Canada to engage in local policy advocacy and coalition work as a representative of SUTE. This work meaningfully supports existing campaigns/local advocacy efforts across the country that address community-identified or urgent policy needs.

In 2023, youth leaders in this program:

Facilitated a demonstration where 100 letters stylized as job application cover letters were hand delivered to the office of the Minister and Labour of Workforce Employment, and Development, Disability Inclusion. This initiative was in support of the Youth Climate Corps program that aimed to create sustainable jobs for

youth.

SUE BIGOL

Launched 'Infiltrate the System', a virtual community bulletin board that short-lists news, events, and grassroots calls-to-action to improve the accessibility of local advocacy initiatives to the general public. Expanded our '**Map the System**' interactive database of activist organizations across what is currently Canada to facilitate connections amongst like-minded advocates promoting sustainability and justice.

MAP THE SYSTEM

Engaged over **100 changemakers** at our Sue Big Oil event in Vancouver. The event celebrated the release of our Sue Big Oil party-planing kit that helps everyday citizens raise awareness about the campaign to hold polluters accountable.

SUYC members consistently participated in meetings and working groups with our affiliated networks and coalitions to identify and respond to community-based concerns. Responding to calls-to-action involved the creation of climate engagement tool-kits for the general public, launching social campaigns, media and amplification of key messages from our ally organizations.


